
#### A REPORT ON THE ALUMNI FEEDBACK, 2020 – 2021


- a) The usefulness of the courses in terms of employment and entrepreneurship

62 alumni participated in the survey consisting of 16 questions.


Mention your Shift in the college 62 responses




What Program did you complete? 62 responses




Which stream of the program did you complete? 62 responses




### The course taught are useful for life 62 responses



## The courses taught are useful for employment and entrepreneurship 62 responses




# The courses taught are useful for higher studies and career planning 62 responses




### Syllabus updated regularly


### Courses in the programme are appropriate and relevant




### Teachers subject knowledge / expertise




# Teaching / Communication style of the faculty in the college 62 responses








### The evaluation primarily test






### Continuous Internal Assessment is an instrument of 62 responses

#### Respondent details

Out of 62 alumni, 51.6% from shift -I and balance 48.4% from shift -II

#### Program completed

The respondents are from UG, PG, and M.Phil. Out of total respondents of 62, 54.8% from UG, 40.3% from PG, and the balance from M.Phil.

#### Stream of the program completed

The respondents are from different programs out of which 40.3% of respondents are from Arts Stream, 30.6% of respondents from the science stream, 21% from the commerce stream, and balances are from B.B.A and B.Com (Corporate)

#### The usefulness of the Courses: Employment and Entrepreneurship

45.2% of respondents agree with the usefulness of the course taught, 33.9% rated as strongly agree and the remaining alumni are neutral. 41.9% of respondents have agreed that the course taught is helpful for employment and entrepreneurship, 22.6% of respondents strongly agreed and balance respondents are neutral.

#### The usefulness of the Courses: Higher Studies and Career Planning

35.5% of the alumni expressed that courses taught here are useful for their higher studies and career planning. 29% of them strongly agree with the above statement and the remaining of them are neutral.

#### **Syllabus Updation and Course Relevance**

45.2% of the alumni agreed with the above statement and 19.4% have strongly agreed with the above. 43.5% of respondents agreed that courses are appropriate and relevant and 25.8% rated as strongly agreeing with the appropriateness and relevancy of the program.

#### Teachers Subject Knowledge/Expertise and Teaching/Communication style

33.9% of the alumni rated the teacher's knowledge in the subject is good. 25.8% and 24.2% of them rated as excellent and very good respectively. 35.5% of the respondents rated the teaching style of the faculty is good. 35.5% and 24.2% of them rated as good and excellent respectively.

#### **Helping Slow Learners**

27.4% of the respondent rated as good for helping the slow learners. 27.4% and 22.6% and 19.4% of respondents have rated as very good, average, and excellent.

#### **Evaluation**

56.5% of the alumni expressed evaluation is mainly on memory and followed by 25.8% is based on analytical skills. 14.5% stated that it is based on creativity and the rest on communication skills. 53.2% of the alumni rated evaluation as fair and 29% rated it as objective-based. 38.7% of the alumni rated the CIA as an instrument for keeping us involved, 40.3% is mentioned that is useful for continuous learning.

#### **Mentoring System**

33.9% of the respondents rated the mentoring system is useful and 22.6% expressed it is very useful.

#### Facilities to Help Learning, Teaching, Evaluation, and Research

The majority of the alumni have rated the facilities as excellent in terms of the library, digital library, and Wi-Fi for learning, teaching, evaluation, and research.

#### Conclusion

#### A REPORT ON THE EMPLOYER FEEDBACK, 2020 -21

Emphasizing quality and excellence, Loyola College performs quality control measures to uphold quality educational services by initiating the conduct of feedback from various stakeholders through IQAC. As part of this professional exercise, whenever the recruiters visit the college for campus interview/providing training sessions or the Job Fair, IQAC collects feedback at random from them and they express their views objectively on the employability skills of the students appearing for the Placement/Campus Interview. The Placement Cell also provides training on communication skills and conducts mock interviews and group discussions as part of preparing the students for placement and insists on employability skills development. The questionnaire includes important and specific aspects like:

- i) Course content is relevant and need-based,
- ii) Development of analytical, logical, technical, and creative skills
- iii) Activities like an internship, field visit, and guest lectures,
- iv) Assignment and seminars.

#### **Exposure and Skill levels**

The majority of the employers have given a rating as excellent in terms of presentation skills, aptitude, behavioral skills, and attitude of students.

#### Facilities and provisions

75% of employers expressed their rating as good, 25% rated as satisfactory in respect of facilities and provisions for campus placement provided by the college.

#### Course Content: Relevance and Need

75% and 25% of employers' ratings were as good, and satisfactory respectively. 75% of employers have conveyed their rating as good in respect of course content has enough scope for development of analytical, logical, technical, and creative skills students and balance 25% rated as satisfactory.

Course Activities (Internships/Field Visit/Guest

#### Lectures/Assignments/Seminars/Others)

50% of employers expressed their rating as good in respect of course activities i.e internships /field visits/guest lectures/assignments/seminars/others and balance 50% rated as satisfactory.

#### Curriculum Design

50% of employers conveyed their rating as good in terms of curriculum designed as per requirements of industry and market and balance 50% rated as satisfactory. After taking into consideration all the factors and overall design of the curriculum the employer rated it as excellent, good, and satisfactory equally.

internal assessment test & semester examinations, co-curricular programs,








Which Porgramme and year does your ward Pursue? 85 responses




What is the stream of study of your ward? 85 responses




# Academic Program in Loyola is 85 responses



## Quality of the teachers at Loyola is 85 responses




# Accessibility of the teacher for parents in the department 85 responses






### Usefulness of the Outreach programme 85 responses









How do you rate the transformation of your ward after the completion of the course? 81 responses




How do you rate the scholarship/ concessions given to your ward by the college\* 85 responses




How do you rate the various support systems available in the college such as Counselling, Career Guidance and Academic Help



#### Respondent relationship with the student

70.6% of Fathers responded to the questioner while mothers have responded 28.2% and remaining by the guardian of the students.

#### Program and year of the wards

Out of the total parents who responded 63.5% of parents were from UG third year, 22.4% of parents from UG second year, few of the parents from UG first year. The remaining respondent parents were from PG.

#### The stream of study the ward

B.Com students' parents have responded 31.8% on the whole. Science students' parents constituted 24.7%. Followed by 22.4% of Arts student parents. 14.1% from B.B.A and 7.1% from B.Com (Corporate) student's parents.

#### Academic Program, Quality, and Relevance

60% of parents have suggested that the academic program is adequate. 18.9% of parents have responded that the program is rigorous. 15.3% have given their opinion that the program is not so rigorous. 36.5% of parents have rated the quality and relevance of the course is excellent. 37.6% of parents have graded as very good. The remaining parents have graded as good and average.

#### Quality and Accessibility of the teachers

Out of 85 responses from the parents concerning the quality of teachers, 34.1% of parents have gauged as very good and 36.5% parents have assessed excellent. 23.5% of parents have graded as good and the balance contributes to average and poor. In respect of accessibility of teachers for parents in the department, 25.9% of parents rated as excellent and 32.9% of parents graded as very good. 28.2% of parents rated as good and the remaining parents rated as average and poor.

#### Internship, Usefulness of the Outreach program and Co-curricular activities

The majority of parents rated it as greatly useful (71.8%) and somewhat useful (18.8%) with regards to the internship as part of the degree program. In respect of the usefulness of the outreach program, 69.4% of parents responded as greatly useful and 18.8% graded it as somewhat useful.36.5% of parents graded co-curricular activities as helpful to the students.

50.6% of parents strongly agree that it is helpful to students. The remaining parents have graded as neutral.

#### Infrastructure

51.8% of parents rated it as excellent and 30.6% of parents graded it as very good.

Balance responded as good, average, and poor in respect of infrastructure on the campus.

**Standard of the Continuous Internal Assessment Test and Semester Examinations** 48.2% of parents rated as excellent and 29.4% rated as very good. 16.5% of parents graded as good and the balance parents graded as average and poor.

#### Transformation of your ward after the completion of the course

40.7% of parents rated it excellent, 34.6% rated it as very good and 16% graded it as good.

#### Scholarship, Concessions, and Support Systems

40% of parents have given scholarship /concession ratings as good. 21.2% of parents have rated it as very good whereas 17.6% have rated it as excellent. 22.9% of parents have given

a good rating to the support system. 37.3% of parents have given a very good rating and 27.7% of parents have said it is excellent.

#### **Jobs and Placements**

22.4% of parents are satisfied with placement activities and have graded it as good, 34.1% of parents have rated it as very good and 28.2% of parents rated it as excellent.

#### Overall impression of the college

48.2% of parents have an excellent impression of the college, 27.1% have a very good impression and 14.1% of parents have a good impression of the college.

- Overall Impression of the Program & Facilities





How do you rate the syllabus of the course that you have gone through in relation to the expected outcome of the course?




How do you rate the allocation of credits and hours to the courses? 1,288 responses




Syllabus of each course covers recent trends and developments 1,288 responses




How do you rate the various papers in terms of their relevance to the specialization streams? 1,288 responses




### Teaching methods followed by teachers 1,288 responses



### The objectivity of assessment and evaluation 1,288 responses




The provisions that are available for students accompaniment in the college 1,288 responses




How do you rate learning resources that are available in the college (Library, Lab, ICT Provisions and others)?



#### The Outcome of the Curriculum and Syllabus

Around 93% of 1288 students who participated in the survey emphasized that they had 'good' to 'excellent' expected outcomes from the courses they have undergone and 95% rated the allocation of credits and hours to the courses as 'good' and 'excellent'. There was a positive response of 87% to the question on the syllabus of each course covering the recent trends and developments while 13% expressed their dissatisfaction. 92.6% of the students responded good to excellent to the question on the various papers in terms of their relevance to the specialization streams whereas 7.4% of the students recorded that the relevance was poor and average.

#### **Teaching Methodologies & Assessment Strategies**

90% of students who participated in the survey opined that the methodologies used by the teachers were good to excellent whereas the remaining 10% of them noted that they were poor and average. 90.5% of the students appreciated the objectivity of assessment and evaluation while the remaining 9.5% of them expressed that it was average and poor.

#### Learning Resources, Facilities and Guidance

With regard to the provisions that are available for students accompaniment in the college, 92.1% of the students expressed that they were good to excellent while the remaining 7.9% noted that it was average and poor. 






Course Outcomes are well defined and clear to staff and students. 201 responses




Course Content has enough scope for development of analytical, logical, technical and creative skills to the students.






The course/syllabus has good balance between theory and application. 201 responses




Courses motivate students to use various resources that are available in the college and outside for their effective learning.








The academic freedom and opportunity that are available for curriculum development, administration and evaluation in the college is:



their relevance to the specialization streams whereas 9.1% of the students recorded that

the relevance was poor and average.
