



Synopsis of the Activity (Description)

Highlights of the Activity	 Understanding the role of Counselling psychology in forensic fields in terms of collecting witness statements and evidence Inferences made under different aspects of psychology pertaining to in-depth analysis of memory retention under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
Key Takeaways	1. The roles of a psychologist do not pertain only to their respective fields but the need of psychology overlap irrespective of their specific fields and together must aid in understanding human behaviour.
Summary of the Activity	Prof. Heather D Flowe initially started the lecture by talking about methods of experimental psychology and how accurately can we believe the results that are undertaken for a research study. She demonstrates a few procedures for memory retention tests and discusses how results arising from those tests cannot be used on a day-to-day basis by any human. The practicality of the tests should be in such a way that we can assess memory in the most evident yet simple way possible, she spares a few references from the experiments she has conducted for her research. Later the lecture takes a deep dive into how memory can be affected due to the intake of alcohol or drugs, in a criminal setting most of the crimes such as sexual assault, and physical assault are done in cases of

	alcohol influence and this can greatly affect the memory thereby
	affecting the quality of the witness statements or evidence. She
	also brought light to the role of a counselling psychologist whose
	methods seem to create an impact on the well-being of the
	individual and help gather important information, witness
	statements, and evidence without any disturbances that can be later
	proven useful for legal purposes. She also highlighted the lack of
	skills modern psychologists possess, through this we were able to
	acknowledge the growth in the realm of criminal justice and
	psychology.
