Session Proceedings

Dr. Stefanie introduced herself briefly and explained the power and the impact of media on society. She emphasized the importance of the quality of the news and its authenticity rather than the circulation figure of the newspaper because this will impact the trustworthiness of the news media / newspaper.

Journalist are supposed to be 'of the fellow citizens' and 'not of the state' or 'not of the politicians' declared, Dr. Stefanie, when emphasizing the quality of a journalist. She explained the deplorable condition of the today's journalism as 'good business but bad journalism'. She also explained about the Attacks on Media Freedom, the Politics of Impunity and Roles & Responsibilities of a Journalist.

Talking about Media Victimisation, Dr. Stefanie said that Media is being victimised by political threats, emotional or physical harassment and economic pressure leading to shut down of the media houses.

Towards the end of session, she briefed about her discipline and the courses offered in the University of Sheffield.
