#### **ABOUT STUDENTS ACTIVITIES:**

## **DENGUE AWARENESS CAMP (17th October, 2017)**

Due to the sudden outbreak of Dengue in the State, the Dean Students Office collaboration with the team of Representatives Class organized one day awareness program on the Prevention of Dengue.
